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- The VOAD consists of organizations active in disaster response throughout the state of North Carolina.
- The VOADs role is to bring organizations together and enable them to understand each other and work together during times of disaster preparedness, response, relief and recovery.
- The North Carolina VOAD adhere to the principles established by the National VOAD. The principles are referred to as the 4C's: Cooperation, Communication, Coordination and Collaboration.
- These principles serve as the foundation for the North Carolina VOAD as it collaborates with local, regional and national partners to coordinate disaster relief, response and recovery efforts in times of disaster.
- The VOAD also supports Long Term Recovery Groups active in disaster and recovery.
